Addressing Teachers

Students shall address teachers in the accepting manner during the time that they are serving in their official capacity. First names and nicknames shall not be used by students in speaking to teachers. Students are expected to show proper respect to all teachers, employees and their property of Mackay School District.

Assemblies

Assemblies will be held generally during 7th hour and will usually run 35 minutes. All school assemblies are sponsored by the student council and faculty of Mackay High School. These assemblies are part of the total educational program. Students, by law, are under the jurisdiction of the school for the entire school day and therefore, are required to attend school assemblies. You are not to leave the building or campus during assembly—it carries the same disciplinary action as truancy.

Attendance

One criterion of a student's success in school is regular and punctual attendance. Frequent absences may lead to poor academic work, lack of social development and possible academic failure. No single factor may interfere with a student's progress more quickly than frequent tardiness or absence; therefore, regular and punctual patterns of attendance are expected of each student.

Currently, the Mackay Junior/Senior High School attendance policy is being revised and will be available soon pending school board approval. Current attendance policy will be followed until the revised attendance policy is approved.

Cell Phones/Headphones

Cell phones/head phones are allowed on campus; however, **they are not allowed in the classroom at any time.** Students who choose to bring the devices to school are required to have them turned off and out of sight. Violation of this policy will result in the device being confiscated. The district will use reasonable care to safeguard confiscated devices, but will not be responsible if the devices are lost or stolen. Students or their parents may seek return of the devices consistent with disciplinary policies.

Definition: electronic communication and entertainment devices shall include, but not limited to cell phones, IPODS, blackberry, pagers, MP3 players, and other similar devices or media players, without regard to the commercial name or manufacturer of the device. Violations of this policy will be handled as follows:

1st referral: device will be turned into the office and returned to student at the end of the school day.

2nd referral: device will be turned into office and returned to a parent/guardian.

3rd referral: device will be turned into office and returned to a parent/guardian and the student loses the right to carry device during the school day. Failure to comply will result in insubordination and the resulting consequences.

Classroom Behavior

Misbehavior is a matter of choice. Choosing to disrupt class infringes upon the right of the teacher to teach and the right of the other students in the class to learn. Even those disruptions that appear minor in nature seriously interfere with the educational process. The following are expectations of all students:

Supplies and Materials: All students will bring the necessary supplies and materials to class to ensure their progress and success.

Classroom Behavior: Students are expected to comply with teacher and substitutes guidelines and use courteous behavior towards teachers and other students at all times.

All staff members will utilize these guidelines:

1st Referral: Teacher/student conference and parent contact form mailed home. Discipline may be assigned.

2nd Referral: Principal/student conference and parent contact. Discipline may be assigned.

Mackay School District Code of Conduct The Three R's Responsibility, Respect, Readiness

Responsibility: Jr./Sr. High School students have an obligation to act in a responsible way. They are accountable for their behavior or for an act. They are dependable and reliable.

Respect: Mackay Jr./Sr. High students have an obligation to act in a respectful way. They feel and show honor for others. They are considerate of others. They are worthy of respect.

Readiness: Mackay Jr./Sr. High School students have an obligation to act ready for each day. They are prompt. They are prepared to act. They are willing to work.

Dances

Dances at Mackay High School should be conducted under the following provision:

1. Advisors must be chosen ahead of time. There shall be two advisors; one must be a faculty member and a faculty member must approve the second. They have the right to expel dancers not abiding by the rules.
2. Alcohol, tobacco, and drugs will follow district policy and not be consumed prior to or during dances.
3. Advisors are responsible for the dancers, and discipline matters should be handled as soon as possible.
4. Once a student leaves the dance he/she has left for the entire event, and will not be allowed to return to the dance.

Drug Free School Policy

Students attending school in this district **will not use, possess, sell buy or distribute drugs**, including alcohol, tobacco, controlled substances, or related paraphernalia, on school premises. Any student will violate the district's tobacco, drug, and alcohol use policy when:

1. He or she is on school premises, evidencing behavior that creates a reasonable suspicion that he or she may be illegally under the influence of drugs, including alcohol, tobacco, or controlled substances, on school premises.
2. He or she admits to using, possessing, selling, buying, or distributing drugs, including alcohol, tobacco, or controlled substance on school premises.
3. He or she is found to use, possess, sell, buy, or distribute drugs, including alcohol, tobacco, controlled substances, or related paraphernalia, on school premises.
4. He or she is found to possess drugs, including alcohol, tobacco, controlled substances, or related paraphernalia, or to have such substances on his or her person, or in his or her locker, vehicle, or other property on school premises.

Disciplinary Actions for Selling or Distribution of Controlled Substances/Alcohol/Tobacco.

1. Suspension: The student will be suspended from school to a maximum of ten days.
2. Parent Notification: The parent/legal guardian will be notified of the offense.
3. Law Enforcement Referral: The student will be referred to the appropriate law enforcement agency.
4. Expulsion: The principal will refer the matter to the superintendent's office. The superintendent will recommend that the board of trustees expel the student.

Disciplinary Action for Other Offenses Involving Controlled Substances/Alcohol/Tobacco

1. May be suspended
2. Police may be called and parents notified.
3. Meet with principal before returning to school. It is recommended that the principal consider the following:
 - a. On the first offense, in addition to being suspended, the students may be referred to a counselor from Road to Recovery. The counselor will meet the student at the school on a regular basis.
 - b. Following the student's return from suspension, the student will automatically be referred to the school's student assistance core team where one member will be assigned to follow up periodically with the student. The student may also be assigned to an education group within the school to help encourage him/her to stay away from involvement with drugs and alcohol.
 - c. Meet with principal. Principal will outline specific programs for each student, including attendance and academic progress reports on a weekly basis.
 - d. Be required to perform up to thirty hours of school service. (This includes service hours required by the courts.)
 - e. May be given other assignments, and any further violations shall cause the student to be referred to the board of trustees for possible expulsion.

Fighting

All students attending Mackay High School will be free from intimidation by other students. Fighting, unnecessary roughness, hazing, or harassment on the part of any student will not be tolerated. Any infraction of this regulation either in the school or on school grounds will be referred to the principal.

Violators may be suspended from school for up to three days upon the first offense. On the second offense they could be suspended for up to five days. If a 3rd offense occurs the student will be referred to the Board of Trustees for expulsion. Fighters may also be referred to the police if it is determined by the principal that the situation has not been settled.

Guidelines for Student Medication

Authorization: it is imperative that a Request for Medication as School form be completed and signed by the parent or guardian and the student's physician. The physician's order must be renewed annually. Any dosage changes in the standing order require a new physician's order.

Labeling, Storage, Disposal: all medication must be received at school in its original prescription container. Medications should be brought to school by the parent or guardian, especially for elementary students. If this is not possible, the parent, or guardian must inform the building principal by telephone the student is bringing the medication to school and how much medication is in the container. The amount of medication received will be verified and documented by the school building principal.

Medications administered by school personnel will be kept in a locked storage cabinet. Access to medication will be under the authority of the school principal. At the end of the school year, parents or guardians will be notified and asked to pick up unused medication. All unused medications left at the school 30 days beyond parental notification will be destroyed by the school principal and witness by another school employee.

Harassment & Bullying

Harassment and bullying means a knowing and willful course of conduct directed at a specific person which seriously alarms or annoys the person and which serves no legitimate purpose. The course of conduct such as this would cause a reasonable person to suffer substantial emotional distress. We shall respond to hazing and/or harassment and bullying in a manner that effectively deters from future incidents. (see Mackay School District guidelines under Bullying)

Hats/Hoodies/Sunglasses

Hats of any type, including hoodies, are not to be worn in the school building or cafeteria during any time. Hoodies are considered to be the same as wearing a hat. (If students have a shirt or jacket with a hoodie attached, they will be acceptable as long as they do not wear the hoodie on their head) Students caught wearing hats on campus may receive a disciplinary write-up and the hat will be held in the office until the end of the day. After the third offense, the hat will only be released to a parent. Sun glasses, hats, or other head-wear are not to be worn in school during school hours (8:00 until after the final bell ending the school day.) They are permitted at school functions held after regular school hours.

Littering

We expect our students to take pride in the building, grounds, and facilities of Mackay High School. A neat, well-groomed appearance makes a comfortable setting for learning and gives favorable impression to our community. Students who purposely litter in the building or on the school grounds will be appropriately disciplined by the principal. During lunch hour no food or drinks are allowed in the gym.

Lockers

Each student will be assigned a locker. Locks may be rented from the office. It is the student's responsibility to close their lockers each time they enter them. Students are warned not to leave money and/or expensive possessions in their lockers. The school reserves the right to search all students' lockers as part of the routine inspection.

Out-Of-School Suspension (OSS)

Students whose behavior is considered disruptive or who have a continual non-resolved behavior problem may be suspended out of school. This action is deemed very serious and will require a parent-student-principal conference before reinstatement can take place. The intention of the staff at Mackay High School is to provide a continuous, uninterrupted education for all students. Students suspended out-of-school for inappropriate behavior will be expected to maintain their work in all classes.

1. Students suspended will be allowed to request their assignments and be given an opportunity for missed school work.
2. Inappropriate behavior warranting out-of-school suspension would include: **fighting, habitual tardies, flagrant truancy, or inability for self-control. Any areas considered disruptive or a continuous non-compliance of school regulations could result in an out-of-school suspension.**
3. **Students on out-of-school suspension will not be allowed to attend any extra-curricular activity or practices related to activities on the days of suspension. All coaches and advisors will be notified of the suspension.**

Public Display of Affection

It is expected that all students will observe acceptable moral standards of behavior in school. Students that are overly affectionate or familiar with each other create embarrassing incidents for other students or school officials. Such students will be warned first, and then referred to principal for disciplinary action.

Search and Seizure Policy

Students are advised that is the policy of School District #182 that members of the administrative staff have the authority to search the student lockers and all other school property over which the school district has control at any time, without student consent, and without a search warrant. Members of the administration staff also have the authority to search the personal property of students when reasonable under the circumstances. This authority to search school property, or personal property of the student when appropriate, is extended to members of the teaching staff who accompany students on out-of-town activities for school-related purposes at school district expense.

Tardiness

Tardiness is defined as the appearance of a student, without a proper excuse, after the scheduled time that a class begins. Punctuality is important in the learning process and in the world beyond school.

Currently, the Mackay Junior/Senior High School tardy policy is being revised and will be available soon pending school board approval. Current tardy policy will be followed until the revised tardy policy is approved.

Pop and Juice Machines

The pop and juice machines are in the school for the convenience of the students. Water, pop and food may be allowed in the classroom upon the teacher discretion.

Freedom of Expression

Students are protected in their exercise of their First Amendment rights at MHS. The exercise of such rights, however, must be conducted in a manner that does not disrupt the educational process. Mackay High School will not tolerate any graffiti, clothing, or actions that degrade any nationality or culture.

Leaving Campus

Once a student is in school, he/she will not leave school for any reason without checking out through the office and contacting their parents. **Students, who leave without checking out first, will be truant.** Permission to leave the school will be granted once the office has talked to the parent. Students may excuse from class only through of the office or another member of the staff.

Schedule Changes

Changes to the schedule will be made only under the following circumstances:

- Student has previously earned a credit in the course.
- Student has not completed the required prerequisite for the course.
- Course change is required to meet graduation requirements.
- A multidisciplinary team (consisting of the student, parents, registrar and or principal meets and determines a change is in the best academic, social, emotional, and/or psychological interest of the student.)

Sexual Harassment

Purpose: it is the policy of the Mackay School District No. 182 to maintain learning and working environment that is free from sexual harassment.

Authority: it shall be a violation of this policy for any member of the district staff to harass a student or another staff member through conduct or communications of a sexual nature as defined below. It shall also be a violation of this policy for students to harass other students through conduct or communications of a sexual nature as defined below:

Definitions: unwelcome sexual advance, requests for sexual favors and other inappropriate, or written or physical conduct of a sexual nature when made by a member of the school staff to a student or another member or when made by any student to another student constitute sexual harassment when:

- A. submission to such conduct is made, either explicitly or implicitly, a term or condition of an individual's education.
- B. Submission to or rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as the basis for academic decision affecting the individual.
- C. Such conduct has the purpose or effect of substantially interfering with an individual's academic or professional performance or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive academic environment.

Sexual harassment, as defined above, may include but is not limited to the following: verbal harassment or abuse; pressure for sexual activity; repeated remarks to a person, with sexual or demanding implications; unwelcome touching; suggesting or demanding sexual involvement accompanied by implied or explicit threats concerning one's grades, job, etc.

Procedures: Any person who alleges sexual harassment by any staff member or student in the district may complain directly to the building principal or other individual's designated to receive such complaints. Reporting sexual harassment will not reflect upon the individual's status nor will it affect future employment, grades or work assignments. The right to confidentiality, both of the complainant and of accused, will be respected consistent with the district's legal obligations, and with the necessity to investigate allegations of misconduct and take corrective action when this conduct has occurred. A substantiated charge against a staff member in the district shall subject such staff member to disciplinary action, including discharge. A substantiated charge against a student in the school district shall subject that student to disciplinary action including suspension or expulsion, consistent with the student discipline code.

Student Dress Code

Although personal dress and appearance is left to the good taste and discretion of the individual student and his/her parents or guardian it is expected that such attire meet inclement weather conditions and the traditional norms of the community, society, and work place; and must not distract from the educational process.

All students are expected to dress in an appropriate and respectable manner, adhering to the following clothing policy during the school day in order to help provide a safe and orderly school environment, and promote pride in personal appearance and in the school:

1. Clothing must be clean and in good repair.
2. Shoes must be worn in all instances.
3. No caps, hats, or other head covers of any kind
4. Garments that expose the midriff, cleavage, shoulders, buttocks, or back should not be worn to school at any time.
5. Spaghetti straps, tank tops, halter tops, tube tops, muscle shirts, or any other shirt types which expose under-clothing (including sports bras) and/or the chest and stomach area are not allowed.
6. No spandex-type (biking) shorts, pants, or any other form fitting clothing is to be worn to school.
7. Students may not wear underwear as outerwear or clothing that reveals underwear.
8. Length of skirts, dresses, “skorts”, or shorts should be no higher than mid-thigh (finger tip length or longer).
9. Clothing that advertises tobacco, alcoholic beverages, or illegal drugs are not allowed.
10. Clothing that displays obscene or immoral pictures, slogans, or other questionable statements or pictures are not allowed.
11. Gang related clothing or paraphernalia will not be permitted at any time during school or school activities. (i.e. rage, bandannas, jackets, shirts, chains, spikes, or other offensive material.)

Students who are in violation of the dress standards policy will be sent to the office where parents will be notified. Students may then be sent home to change their clothing. The absence from school will be considered unexcused. Items may also be retained by the school administration.

Student Language

The Board of Trustees seeks to provide an educational environment that respects the dignity and value of the individual student and district employee. While students have the right to express concerns, grievances, and viewpoints before school officials and fellow students; school officials may govern the time, place and manner of such activity. At no time are students allowed to engage in speech or expression that is defamatory, invades or threatens to invade the rights of others, presents the likelihood of substantial disorder or is disruptive to the educational process.

Language which is profane, threatening, name calling or discriminatory in nature or content is prohibited on school premises, at school activities or events without regard to location or on school sponsored transportation.

Use of language may result in progressive discipline of individual student to be established by the principal. Such students will be warned first, and then referred to the principal for disciplinary action. Any **third** incident may result in suspension or a recommendation of expulsion of the student to the Board of Trustees. In all circumstances, the principal may elect to take an incident directly to the Board for expulsion, depending on the severity of the incident.

Visitors

For the safety of the students and the faculty, **ALL** visitors must register with the office. Disruptions to the classrooms must be kept to a minimum. Only school personnel will be allowed to remove a student from a classroom. Visitors are welcome to visit our school and speak with teachers; however, prior arrangements must be made. Students who are not enrolled in Mackay High School should not be on school grounds without prior approval from the principal.

Weapons or Dangerous Toys in School

Possession or use of any object that might be considered a weapon or dangerous toy is prohibited. Any object found in the possession of a student that could be classified as a weapon will be confiscated and will not be returned to the student. If a threat is made against any student or employee of Mackay School District with a weapon or dangerous toy, the offender will be suspended from school until appropriate action can be taken.

Zero Tolerance for Weapons, Explosives

It is the policy of the Board of Trustees of School District #182 that any student who has a weapon as defined by Idaho law, or who uses or threatens the use of any normal non-dangerous implement as a weapon, will be immediately suspended from school. If the suspension lasts more than two days, the principal shall hold due process hearing to determine if the student's action merit a recommendation to the Board for expulsion.

Building administrators are required to distribute a disclosure statement regarding policy 724.0 Zero Tolerance for Weapons, Explosives that all students and all parents of students in grades K-12 must sign in when a student registers for the beginning of each school year. All students and parents/guardians are required to complete, sign and return the form to office within one week of s student being enrolled at Mackay Jr./Sr. High School.

5th Year Seniors

It is our hope most students will complete their high school career in 4 years. However, we recognize that due to circumstances some may not. Mackay High School will allow students to return and finish their education under the following contract:

1. Must take five classes each semester. (full load)
2. No Off Campus will be allowed.
3. Must work towards graduation through the quickest possible path.
4. Must not violate attendance/discipline policy.
5. May not receive a failing grade.

If any of the above guidelines are not carried out the student will be referred to other programs.

ELIGIBILITY FOR EXTRA-CURRICULAR AND CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The intent of the eligibility policy is to help motivate students who have less intrinsic motivation in academic effort. The reward for at least minimum academic performance is being eligible to participate in co-curricular activities. These activities are any form of competition, performance or club activity contest, cheerleading, band, choir, or other performances based activities. Ineligible students will not be allowed to travel in school vehicles. Specifically excluded from the eligibility policy is attendance at school events such as athletic contests and school dances.

Definitions:

Eligible: The privilege of participating in co-curricular activities.

Ineligible: Not having the privilege of participating in extra- and co-curricular activities.

Students will be allowed to participate in practice sessions while ineligible, however, they will not be allowed to “suit up”, participate with the group at time of competition or performance, and be released from school for competitions, activities, and performances.

Principal, Athletic Director, Head Coaches, and Advisors are responsible for monitoring students’ Progress towards academic eligibility for all extra-curricular and co-curricular activities.

While each club or organization may have its own constitution and eligibility requirement, the minimum standard cannot be less than Board policy.

Students participating in extra-curricular and co-curricular activities **MUST** maintain the following academic standards:

1. Must pass 6 out of 7 classes from the previous semester. Example: you must pass 6 of 7 classes first semester in order to play winter sports: Basketball, Cheerleading, Wrestling, Track, etc., you must pass 6 of 7 classes second semester in order to play Football, Volleyball, Cheerleading, etc., for the following fall season. (IHSAA Guidelines) Students may use passing summer school course grades to replace failing grades from the second semester, this will allow for fall participation. Students taking off-campus or release time must pass 6 out of 6 classes.
2. Eligibility will be checked every three weeks. The Athletic Director, FFA Advisor, and/or Head of Co-Curricular event will provide an “Eligibility Check” calendar to the Principal for the entire year.
3. If, at time of a scheduled check, a student is found to be below a 2.0 GPA or has one (1) “F”, he/she will be placed on probation for the next three weeks until which time the next eligibility check will take place.
4. During this 3-week probation period, the students will be able to participate. It is during this time the student and parents need to meet with the teacher and discuss how to best improve the academic status of the student.
5. Within two (2) days of the eligibility check, the Principal and/or Athletic Director and/or Head Coach and/or Advisor will notify the student and parents in writing and by phone concerning the probationary status.
6. If at the end of the 3-week probation period the student remains ineligible, he/she will not be allowed to participate until a passing grade is received.
